ADVENT & CHRISTMAS EVENTS

- DAILY ONLINE DEVOTION & PRAYER. From November 29th thru December 24th, we will have a daily devotion and prayer online.
- <u>SUNDAY WORSHIP</u>. We continue to meet inperson at the church building. Worship begins at 10:00 a.m. on Sundays. Social distancing takes place. You must wear a mask whenever closer than 6 feet from people who are not from your own household. We make that worship service available <u>ONLINE</u> starting on the next Sunday morning.
- "BLUE CHRISTMAS" SERVICE. Many people feel "down" or "blue" —especially during the holidays. The pandemic can intensify those feelings. We will have an ONLINE worship service to acknowledge our grief, fears, stress, sadness, and anxiety. We will also lift up the comfort and hope that comes from God. This service will be available online anytime after 7:00 pm. on December 14th. We will leave it available at least through late January.
- ONLINE CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE. We will have an ONLINE service of scripture, carols, and candles. WE WILL NOT HAVE AN INDOOR SERVICE. Light a candle at home and watch the online service. It will debut at 1:00 p.m on December 24th and be online until late January. You won't want to miss this online service!
- OUTDOOR CHRISTMAS EVE SERVICE. Join us at 5:00 p.m on December 24th on the church lawn (weather permitting) for some scriptures, a couple of carols, a brief message. We will close by singing "Silent Night" (with buttery-operated "candles"). The service will be brief. We will be socially distanced. Bring a face covering (in case you chose to be closer than 6 feet from other people). EVERYONE IS INVITED!

THANKS-LIVING

When I was an undergraduate student, I would attend worship at a United Methodist Church where Rev. Virgil Nulton was the Senior Pastor. One year, Virgil preached a sermon entitled, "Thanks-living"—and the central theme of that sermon "stuck" with me.

We celebrate Thanksgiving **DAY**. On that one **DAY**, some people MIGHT pause for a few **seconds** or a **minute** (or two) to give thanks to God—usually before we eat too much food.

Rev. Nulton suggested that "Thanksgiving" is not something that should be limited to several seconds —-or a couple minutes— on just one day of the year. "Thanksgiving" should become an everyday lifestyle for each of us. Hence the phrase, "Thanks-living".

In 1 Thessalonians 5:18, we find these words: "...give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus."

So, give thanks in a pandemic. Give thanks when there are numerous COVID-related rules and restrictions. Give thanks for school closures and for online classes and distance learning.

Give thanks—both during and after—a very hotly contested election season (whether we agree with the election outcome—or not).

Give thanks when things are "going our way" and when things are pleasant—and especially give thanks when things are **NOT** "going our way" and when things are unpleasant. Give thanks in **ALL** circumstances.

I would invite you to take some time during this Thanksgiving season for you (and your family members) to truly "give thanks". I would even challenge each of us to write down a list of all of the things for which we are thankful. Then, let us give thanks to God for each of the items on our lists. Take time to tell others about the many things for which we are thankful.

Let us have an attitude of <u>"Thanks-living"</u>.

HOLIDAY FOOD DRIVE

In-person classroom instruction will resume on January 19, 2021. Remote instruction and remote learning will occur until that date. Please keep the students, teachers, staff, and administrators in your thoughts and prayers.

WHY OUR CHURCH IS OPEN

Throughout the pandemic, our Church Board of Directors has continually evaluated what is the best response for our church to the COVID-19 situation.

They most recently discussed the matter on Nov, 22nd. The discussion was very thoughtful and explored all perspectives, data, and mandates. In the end, the Board decided to still offer both inperson (and online) worship opportunities.

The Board believes (especially during the holidays) that publicly worshiping God is at least as important as grocery stores and other businesses which are open. They believe that being open provides a much needed social interaction for some people. Our members are doing a VERY good job at social distancing, wearing masks, staying home when prudent, etc. Our doors being open sends an important message of hope to the community that God and the Church are present— even in these very uncertain times.
